NB8 Nordic Circle Mentoring Program

NB8 Nordic Circle is a Nordic-Baltic network and mentoring program for the development of producer skills in the independent arts field, especially in dance. The mentoring program has been implemented as a joint project of five Nordic actors. In addition, there were six cooperation partners from the Baltics and autonomous northern regions. The aim of the project was to strengthen the Nordic and Baltic infrastructure for the production, management and distribution of dance.

The NB8 Nordic Circle mentoring program was originally planned for the years 2021–2023, but due to the corona pandemic, the schedule had to be extended. The project was carried out in 2021–2024. The mentoring program included two project cycles, for both of which eight participants were selected through an open call. A suitable mentor from another country was selected for each participant.

PROGRAM PARTNERS

The partners of the project were Arts Management Helsinki (Finland), SITE Sweden (Sweden), JC Copenhagen (Denmark), Performing Arts Hub Norway (Norway) and Dansverksthæðið (Iceland). Cooperation partners in the Baltic countries were New Theater Institute of Latvia (Latvia), Plartforma Lithuania (Lithuania) and Estonian Dance Agency (Estonia). Cooperation partners in other northern regions are Qiajuk Studios (Greenland), The Nordic House (Faroe Islands) and Nordic Institute on Åland (Åland).

Arts Management Helsinki

Arts Management Helsinki is a values-based organization specializing in arts management and administration. The range of activities and services spans from production and project management to career planning and development. Arts Management Helsinki functions as a production platform for 50 independent artists in Finland. SITE is an independent support structure for the performing arts based in Stockholm, Sweden. JC Copenhagen is a private owned organization specializing in advising, managing and administrating smaller companies, self-producing choreographers and artists. PROJECT LAUNCH 2021

After several years of planning and applying, NB8 Nordic Circle project finally received the first approved funding decision by the Nordic Culture Point in April 2021. The project started in August 2021. Project website was launched at www.nb8circle.com. Visual branding of the project was designed by Finnish designer Lille-lle.

The first open call for mentees took place 6.-28.10.2021, and 24 application from all Nordic and Baltic countries were received. Information about the open call was distributed through the network of project partner organizations and associated partner organizations, in the whole Nordic-Baltic region.

Program partners - Outi Järvinen (FI), Ulrika Vilke (FI), Emelie Johansson (SE), Geir Lindahl (NO), Jens Christian Jensen (DK), Tinna Grétarsdóttir (IS) – gathered in Suomenlinna, Finland, 8.-9.11.2021 for a selection meeting, hosted by Nordisk Kulturkontakt. Eight mentees were selected for the first cycle, and they were matched with experienced mentors from another country by the steering group.




KICK-OFF MEETING 2022

The kick-off meeting of the first mentoring cycle was held in Raseborg, Finland **13.–16.9.2022**. The program started with a meeting of the 8 mentors, and the following day they were joined by the 8 mentees. The meeting program consisted of group work, discussions, walk & talk, and participatory activities. The program was facilitated by **Holger Björklund** (SE).

The kick-off meeting took place in Calliola, an idyllic conference center in the Finnish archipelago. With a beautiful setting by the sea, pristine nature, Finnish local food, and professional organization, the international group of mentors and mentees had an inspiring start for the mentoring year.





Kick-off meeting schedule:

After the kick-off meeting, each mentor-mentee pair kept in touch with each other using communication tools about once a month. They met each other in a one-on-one live meeting once during the mentoring year. There was also a joint online meeting with the group of mentors and another one with the mentees organized by the program partners.




WRAP-UP OF CYCLE 1



The open call for mentees for the second cycle was held in October 2022. Out of a total of 31 applicants, eight mentees were selected for the mentoring program. They were matched with eight experienced mentors from other Nordic and Baltic countries. The selection and matching process was conducted by he project partners online, via Zoom. The program cycles ran in overlap; first cycle from September 2022 to August 2023, and second cycle from April 2023 to March 2024.



KICK-OFF MEETING 2023

The kick-off meeting of the second mentoring cycle was held in Raseborg, Finland **18.–21.4.2023**, at Calliola Conference Hotel. The program started with an intensive training for the 8 mentors, as in the first cycle. The training was developed based on the feedback from the first cycle, and small changes were made in the program. On the second day of the kick-off meeting, the mentors were joined by the 8 mentees, for two and a half days together in the whole group. The program was facilitated by **Holger Björklund** (SE).



Examples of topics discussed in the mentor-mentee pairs:

- finding a future path
- compare best practices, exchanging practices
- how to prioritize
- finding your driving forces, motivation
- setting boundaries for worklife vs personal life
- finding a sustainable income structure
- dealing with the artist-producer relationship
- working with co-production, international collaboration

Each mentor-mentee pair kept in touch with each other using various communication tools. During the mentoring year, they also met each other in a one-on-one live meeting. The program partners arranged a joint online meeting with the group of mentors and another one with the mentees, and also kept in touch to follow-up on the process.

DISSEMINATION

There were a total of 55 mentee applicants for NB8, and the information about the program reached the Nordic and Baltic dance field well in collaboration with the associate partners. The NB8 Facebook page had 625 followers. With the podcast and other publicity, the program has reached nearly a thousand professionals in the professional field. Social media posts were actively made by project participants and partners.

In November 2022, Emelie Johansson gave an online-presentation of NB8 in the On The Move Training group, for international members of the IETM linked network focusing on international professional development training programmes. In April 2023, Ulrika Vilke and Emelie Johansson participated as representatives of the NB8 Nordic Circle project in the Nordic-Baltic Network meeting organized in Tallinn, invited by the Nordic Culture Point. In June 2023, Outi Järvinen, invited by the Nordic Culture Point, presented the project at an online seminar organized by Creative Europe.

Local, regional and national activities were organised by the project partners, to engage the larger community.

FINANCING

NB8 Nordic Circle Mentoring Program was supported by Nordic Culture Point and Nordic Culture Fund, as well as national funding from the Ministry of Education and Culture in Finland, the Swedish Arts Council and the Danish Arts Foundation.

All project partners also self-financed the program by providing staff, administrative help, and in-kind or direct financial support.
